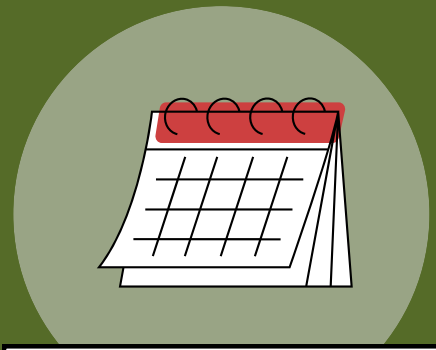
Leave the Leaves

- Leaves are free high quality mulch.
- Fall leaves provide great habitat for beneficial insects.
- As leaves decompose they return nutrients to the soil.
- Insect larvae on the underside of leaves is the #1 food for baby birds.



Propagate Natives

- Many native plant species can be easily propagated.
- Use QR code on the front of this handout to find instructions.
- Willows, Red osier dogwood, Snowberry, and Twinberry have high propagation success rates.



Plant in the Fall

- Native plants survive best when planted in the fall or winter.
- They have less transplant shock and are naturally watered by the rain.
- By planting in the fall you'll save money on watering.
