Black Twinberry	<i>Lonicera involucrata</i>	Moist-seasonally wet
Pacific Ninebark	<i>Physocarpus capitatus</i>	Moist-seasonally wet
Columbia River Willow	<i>Salix exigua var. columbiana</i>	Moist-seasonally wet
Hooker's willow	<i>Salix hookeriana</i>	Moist-seasonally wet
